Life in Kew

On Kew Green there is a cricket every Sunday in the summer. There is St Anne's church built in 1714 and still holding regular services and beautiful weddings. The village pond is home to swans and ducks. There is a May funfair and an annual horticultural show. And overseeing this there are four bustling pubs where patrons can sit and watch.

In Kew village, there is still a butcher, small grocery store, newsagent, pharmacy, dry cleaners and post office, as well as an organic store, bookshop, florist and independent coffee shops and destination restaurants. Live music at the very popular Farmers Market, on the first Sunday of every month, makes this more than just a shopping experience.

The World renowned Royal Botanic Gardens is a UNESCO World Heritage Site that offers over 300 acres of beautiful gardens nestled next to the River Thames at Kew. The gardens also contain 40 historically important buildings and an adventure area for children.
